The Baltic Sea pearls on a Baltic tour with the highlights Curonian Spit- Klaipeda- Riga- Tallinn

So close, so beautiful - in the north-east of Europe, where diversity and contrasts lie side by side in the smallest of spaces, Lithuania, Latvia and Estonia together form the Baltic States. Unique nature, vibrant cities and a wealth of historical sights characterize the three neighboring countries of the Baltic Sea states. Explore the picturesque old towns and let yourself be inspired by the fascinating natural landscapes and coastlines. On this trip you will be rewarded with fairy tale landscapes, untouched nature as you can hardly find it in Western Europe and picturesque cities.

The capitals of the three Baltic states, Vilnius, Riga and Tallinn are not on the UNESCO World Heritage List for nothing!

Visit the new Europe with us! We promise: whoever embarks on this journey will be rewarded with fairytale landscapes, untouched nature such as can hardly be found in Western Europe and picturesque towns. The capitals of the three Baltic States are not on the UNESCO World Heritage List for nothing!

Far away from the cities, countless fragrant forests await us, hilly landscapes with the finest curves, routes with lonely straights through national parks and routes along the beautiful Baltic Sea coast, which invite us to ride our motorcycles!

Of course, on such a round trip through the Baltic republics, a foray through Masuria, the Curonian Spit with its unique sand dunes, the picturesquely situated moated castle of Trakai and the Mountain of Crosses must not be omitted. This trip combines a portion of culture with motorcycle touring.

Day 1: Individual arrival at our starting hotel in Leipzig

Check in until 18:00; tour presentation and getting to know each other over dinner.

Day 2: From Leipzig to Posen (Poland) approx. 400km
On the way you can see the world's largest statue of Jesus in the small Polish town of Swiebodzin (Schwiebus). The 33m high statue of the Son of God is 3m taller than the famous figure in Rio de Janeiro in Brazil. The crown alone is 2m high.

The construction was planned and enforced by the local priest Zawadzki, who thus made Swiebodzin a place of pilgrimage for all believers.

Day 3: From Poznan to Mrągowo - Sensburg (Poland) approx. 440km.

After breakfast we start further in eastern direction, our touring destination today is Mrągowo - Sensburg. This is located in the Masurian region. Along the first Masurian Lakes on winding, lonely roads we reach Sensburg, where we move into our hotel for two nights.

Day 4: Round trip through the Masuria to Heiligelinde and Wolfsschanze incl. guided tour approx. 160km.

Święta Lipka (German Heiligelinde) is a village in the Polish Voivodeship Warmia-Masuria. Święta Lipka is one of Poland's best-known Marian pilgrimage sites and is popular with pilgrims and tourists alike.

In the village, which was East Prussian until 1945, the baroque pilgrimage church Heiligelinde was built by Jesuits. The basilica with cloister and monastery is one of the most important baroque monuments in northern Poland. The Pope elevated it to the rank of basilica minor in 1983.

Wolf's Lair: Wolf's Lair was the cover name for a military situation centre of the command staff of the German Wehrmacht and one of the Führer's headquarters during

World War II near Rastenburg near the village of Görlitz in East Prussia, in present-day Poland.

Day 5: Ride from Mragowo to Vilnius (Lithuania) approx. 350km

Across the Masurian Lake District we tour further east. On the way to Vilnius we also make a detour to the Trakai moated castle. The Trakai Water Castle is probably one of the most visited and most photographed sights in the entire Baltic region.

The late medieval castle complex from the 14th century is picturesquely situated in the middle of the surrounding lake landscape, embedded in a magnificent natural ensemble. In the late afternoon we reach Vilnius, where we will stay for the next 2 days.

Day 6: City tour in Vilnius

After breakfast we start for a city tour. The rest of the day is at your free disposal. Either simply to stroll in the old town or a small tour in the surroundings of Vilnius.

Vilnius, the capital of Lithuania, is famous for its baroque architecture, which is particularly evident in the medieval Old Town. However, the buildings along these partly cobblestone streets reflect different styles and times - from the neoclassical Cathedral of St. Stanislaus to the Gothic Church of St. Anna. The 16th-century Gate of Dawn, which houses an icon of the Virgin Mary, once provided access to the city.

Day 7: Vilnius to Riga (Latvia) approx. 300 km

After the breakfast we make ourselves on the way to Riga. According to scientists from 1989, we will pass the geographical centre of Europe. We continue to the border crossing to Latvia and stay for 2 nights in a hotel in the city centre.

Day 8: City tour Riga

After the breakfast we start to a city tour with a local guide.

Riga, the capital of Latvia, is situated at the mouth of the river Dūna into the Baltic Sea. It is considered a cultural centre and has many museums and concert halls. The city is also known for its wooden buildings, Art Nouveau architecture and medieval Old Town. The latter is accessible only to pedestrians and includes many shops and restaurants. Here you will also find the bustling Livu Square with its bars and nightclubs.

Day 9: Riga to Tallinn (Estonia) approx. 320 km

Today we continue north along the Baltic Sea. We tour towards Estonia, the Baltic country geographically at the top. Estonia is the smallest of the three Baltic states but has a lot to offer. Along the picturesque west coast we tour north and arrive in the capital Tallinn in the afternoon. The medieval old town is world famous. Here we move into our hotel for the next two nights.

Day 10: City tour of Tallinn

Tallinn, the capital of Estonia, is situated at the Baltic Sea and is the cultural centre of the country. It is famous for its cobblestone Old Town, surrounded by a city wall, with numerous cafés and shops, as well as the 15th century defence tower Kiek in de Kōk. Tallinn's historic Town Hall Square is dominated by the Gothic Town Hall with its 64 m high tower. St. Nicholas Church is a landmark from the 13th century.

A special dinner: In a medieval restaurant we may enjoy delicious dishes and herbal drinks, these are prepared by master chefs as in the times of the Hanseatic League.

Day 11: Tallinn- Riga approx. 350km

After breakfast we make our way back towards Riga. Overnight stay in a hotel near the city.

Day 12: Riga via Klaipeda to the Curonian Spit approx. 360 km

At the mountain of the crosses we make a stop. Thousands of crosses - small and large, simple and richly decorated, wooden or metal - are grouped around a statue of Our Lady. At this Lithuanian place of pilgrimage, the crosses symbolise the memories and hopes of Lithuanians.

Klaipėda is a port town in Lithuania, located where the Baltic Sea meets the Danė River. In the old town there are half-timbered houses built in the 18th century in the German style. Theatre Square, the city's main meeting place, houses the neoclassical Drama Theatre. The sculpture Taravos Anikė from 1912 is also located in the square and is a tribute to a poet of the city. The waterfront Lithuanian Maritime Museum includes dolphin shows and maritime exhibits in a 19th-century fortress.

The Curonian Spit is a 98km-long peninsula on the northern coast of the Sambia. It begins in Lesnoi and ends at the Memel Deep. Since 1945 the northern 52 km belong to Lithuania and the southern 46 km to the Russian oblast Kaliningrad.

Here you can expect endless sand dunes, fragrant pine forests and golden beaches. The nature on the spit is unique.

Overnight stay on the Curonian Spit.

Day 13: Curonian Spit - Klaipeda - ferry passage approx. 50km

Ride on the Curonian Spit to the Russian border. Afterwards it goes to the ferry Klaipeda - Kiel

14 Day: Ferry passage - Kiel

A last common breakfast we let pass our journey once again in review. In the afternoon we reach Kiel and start the individual journey home.
