


Trans-Siberia Moscow-Vladivostok (M-ID: 2288)

Come with us on a journey to the biggest country on earth! A tour of superlatives: 25 days. 10,000 km. 8 time zones. Two continents. The highlights: Moscow, Novosibirsk, Ural Mountains, Taiga, Lake Baikal, Far East. Everyone should do this tour at least once in their life.

Our exclusive itinerary:

Day 01: Arrival in Moscow

After the plane has landed safely in Moscow and you have arrived safely at the hotel in the centre of the city, you can acclimatise a little in your rooms before the first tour briefing takes place. Here you will get the details about the itinerary, the route and general information about rules and customs in Russia. Afterwards we will explore Moscow on foot and get a first taste of Russian cuisine in a nice restaurant near the Kremlin.

Day 02: Moscow

A first immersion into Russian life and culture is on the agenda. We start our excursion into the city with the Kremlin and the Red Square, visit the GUM (main shopping centre) and St. Basil's Cathedral. We have time today to change money, get local sim cards if needed and prepare the bikes for the trip.

Day 03: Moscow - Nizhny Novgorod, 580 km In the morning we ride directly to the Red Square to take some pictures of us with the motorcycles. Afterwards we leave Moscow towards the east. Along the Volga River we will make several stops in cities of the "Golden Ring". In Vladimir we will visit the Cathedral of the Assumption, an architectural wonder of the 12th century. In Nizhni Novgorod we will take a walk along the Volga embankment, visit the Novgorod Kremlin and enjoy dinner in a local restaurant.

Day 04: Nizhny Novgorod - Kazan, 460 km In the morning we visit the National Museum in Kozmodemyansk before reaching our overnight destination. Kazan is one of the three capitals of Russia, along with Moscow and Saint Petersburg. We will visit the local Kremlin, which is the second largest Kremlin in Russia after the one in Moscow and dates back to the 10th century. In the evening we will have a delicious dinner from the regional cuisine.

Day 05: Kazan - Izvhevsk, 540 km

We ride to Izvhevsk, the capital of the Republic of Udmurtia, via well-maintained secondary roads and short sections of unpaved roads. The city is best known as the birthplace of Mikhail Timofeyevich Kalashnikov. Here the AK-47 rifles are produced. We visit a weapons museum with a shooting range and everyone who wants can try out an AK-47. We will spend the night in a "very local" hotel with interesting and delicious typical food.

Day 06: Izvhevsk - Yekaterinburg, 710 km Today will be a long day of riding with many scenic roads. We pass oil production facilities and agricultural cultivation areas. After a second breakfast from a regional shop with wild berries, apples and other fruits we will have a glass of vodka in the evening in Yekaterinburg.

Day 07: Yekaterinburg

Rest day. We sleep in and enjoy the free time in the morning. In the afternoon we will have a walking tour of the city with a local guide. We will visit 1905 Square, October Square, the Cathedral on the Blood, the Historical Square, the Stone Garden and the Obelisk on the border between Europe and Asia.

Day 08: Yekaterinburg - Tyumen, 400 km In the morning we visit the Ganina Pit, where the last Russian emperor was buried. Today it is a memorial and a monastery. In Irbit, the place of origin of the Russian "Ural" motorcycles we visit the Ural factory and museum and take a test ride on the Ural motorcycles, surely a great memory. After lunch we will ride to Tyumen, which we will reach in the early evening. We will check in, park our motorcycles in the parking lot and explore Tyumen on foot. We will walk across the Tura River on the embankment and pedestrian bridge and visit the Znamenskiy Cathedral. We will also take a bath in the hot springs in the city center and then have dinner in a nearby restaurant.

Day 09: Tyumen - Omsk, 630 km

On this day a quiet road to Omsk awaits us. On our way we visit Ishim, a small town with well-preserved 19th century architecture. In Omsk we will take a walk through the city and visit the main sights.

Day 10: Omsk - Novosibirsk, 650 km

A peaceful and beautiful road awaits us to Novosibirsk, the largest city on the Trans-Siberian route. Today Novosibirsk is the third largest city in Russia, the cultural and scientific capital of Siberia and home to the largest open-air railway museum in the world. This museum is a must-see for any traveller on the Trans-Siberian Route.

Day 11: Novosibirsk - Kemerovo, 300 km A short day of riding lies ahead, filled with interesting places and people. Today we visit our friends in Urga, a small town in the centre of Siberia. Here we stay for lunch and explore the surroundings a bit. In the afternoon we reach our overnight stop Kemerovo, the centre of the Russian coal industry. We have a look at one or the other museum and spend the evening in a country hotel in the forest. Tomorrow is a long day, so we take time to relax.

Day 12: Kemerovo - Krasnoyarsk, 630 km We are back on the Trans-Siberian route and ride to Krasnoyarsk, another major Siberian city. Krasnoyarsk is located on the Yenisei, one of the longest rivers in the world. We check into our hotel and explore the city centre on foot.

Day 13: Krasnoyarsk

Rest day. Our motorcycles are serviced and we go on an excursion to the Krasnoyarsk National Park "Stolby". We spend at least half a day hiking and climbing in the hills and mountains and get a deep impression of the Russian taiga. Our dinner in a cozy restaurant with local cuisine will surely taste very special.

Day 14: Krasnoyarsk - Tulun, 650 km On the way to Tulun we will see many small villages and make several stops. We spend the night in a country hotel with Russian banya on the bank of the river.

Day 15: Tulun - Listvyanka, 450 km The last 450 km before our arrival at the big Lake Baikal we experience on day 15.

Day 16: Listvyanka / Lake Baikal

After a restful sleep and a healthy breakfast we will visit the Baikal Museum and go to Cherskogo Peak to take pictures of Lake Baikal. We will also visit the local market and go on a boat trip.

Day 17: Listvyanka - Ulan-Ude, 540 km The road to Ulan-Ude follows the shore of Lake Baikal. Ulan-Ude was a Mongolian city long ago and is now part of Russia. It is home to numerous peoples: Buryats, Barguzin Jews, Evenks, Mestizos. There are many Buddhist temples in the city. In the restaurants we will have an opportunity to taste traditional local food and "Baikal omul".

Day 18: Ulan-Ude - Chita, 640 km In the next five days the road to Vladivostok lies ahead of us. The first city on our route is Chita, where the Decembrists (also: Decembrists - aristocratic revolutionaries) were deported to after the attempted uprising of 1825.

Day 19: Chita - Yerofey Pavlovitch, 780 km The city is named after the famous Russian entrepreneur, traveller and explorer Yerofey Pavlovitch. In the 17th century he mapped the Amur River and built a fortress nearby, but unfortunately it has not survived.

Day 20: Yerofey Pavlovich - Blagoveshchensk, 760 km Blagoveshchensk is the fifth largest city in the Far East. It was founded in the mid-19th century to protect the borders of the Russian Empire. The Amur River is the border between Russia and China. Local residents often go to China to drink Chinese beer, buy souvenirs and have a leisurely lunch. After all, China is only half an hour away.

Day 21: Blagoveshchensk After a few long days of riding, today is at leisure.

Day 22: Blagoveshchensk - Khabarovsk, 700 km Khabarovsk is probably the most beautiful city in the Asian part of the Trans-Siberian route. The Amur River reaches one of its widest points, the hills are beautiful and there is an abundance of forests. The city is full of Chinese markets and restaurants and we have the opportunity to try them out.

Day 23: Khabarovsk - Vladivostok, 750 km The last leg of our journey lies ahead of us. Vladivostok is located at the southern end of the Muravyov Amursky Peninsula and is surrounded by the sea on three sides. At the end of the day we will have dinner and a massage.

Day 24: Vladivostok

Rest day. We sleep in comfortably and then start sightseeing. We visit among others the seaport, the dike, the bridge to Russkiy Island, the local pedestrian zone and many other interesting places.

Day 25: Journey home

After a very special trip, the time comes to say goodbye and all participants make their way home. We hope that you were so enthusiastic about Russia and the legend "Trans-Siberia" that one day you will come back for another tour and say to you:

"Do svidaniya" - Till next time - in Russia.
