Come with us on a journey to the greatest country on earth! A tour of superlatives: 25 days. Ten thousand kilometers. 8 time zones. Two continents. The highlights: Moscow, Novosibirsk, Ural Mountains, Taiga, Lake Baikal, Far East. Everyone should do this tour at least once in their life.

Plus picturesque villages and landscapes and Russian cuisine. Simply a dream!!!

The legend. Vladivostok-Moscow. A tour of superlatives: 28 days. 10,000 km. 8 time zones. 2 continents.

The highlights: Moscow, Novosibirsk, Ural Mountains, Taiga, Lake Baikal, Far East, Pacific Ocean. Minimum number of participants: 2 riders.

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Itinerary:

Day 01: Arrival in Vladivostok

After the plane has landed safely in Vladivostok and you have moved into your room, you can acclimatize a little before the first tour briefing takes place. Here you will get the details about the tour, the route and general information about rules and customs in Russia. You get the motorcycles and can make final preparations. During dinner in a local seafood restaurant you will have the opportunity to taste original sea crabs and ask further questions about the tour.

Day 02: Vladivostok

After breakfast we start our sightseeing tour. We will see, among others, the seaport, the dike, the bridge to Russkiy Island, the local pedestrian zone and many other interesting places. We have time to change money, get local sim cards and prepare the bikes for the trip.

Day 03: Vladivostok - Khabarovsk, 750 km

Khabarovsk is probably the most beautiful city in the Asian part of the Trans-Siberian route. The Amur River reaches

one of its widest points, the hills are beautiful and there is an abundance of forests. In the city there are numerous Chinese markets and restaurants and we have the opportunity to try them.

Day 04: Khabarovsk - Blagoveshchensk, 700 km

Blagoveshchensk is the fifth largest city in the Far East. It was founded in the mid-19th century to protect the borders of the Russian Empire. The Amur River forms the border between Russia and China. Local residents often go to China to drink Chinese beer, buy souvenirs and have a leisurely lunch. After all, China is only half an hour away.

Day 05: Blagoveshchensk - Yerofey Pavlovich, 560 km

The city is named after the famous Russian entrepreneur, traveler and explorer Yerofey Pavlovich. In the 17th century he mapped the Amur River and built a fortress nearby, but unfortunately it has not been preserved.

Day 06: Yerofey Pavlovich - Chita, 780 km

Chita, is the city to which the Decembrists (also: Decembrists - aristocratic revolutionaries) were deported after the attempted uprising of 1825.

Day 07: Chita

Rest day in Chita. Who likes can look at the famous museum of the Decembrists.

Day 08: Chita - Ulan-Ude, 640 km

Ulan-Ude was a Mongolian city long time ago and belongs to Russia today. It is home to numerous peoples: Buryats, Barguzin Jews, Evenks, Mestizos. There are many Buddhist temples in the city. In the restaurants we will have an opportunity to taste traditional local food and "Baikal omul".

Day 09: Ulan-Ude - Listvyanka / Lake Baikal, 540 km
The road to Ulan-Ude leads along the shore of Lake Baikal. Today we will experience the largest and one of the purest lakes in the world.

Day 10: Listvyanka / Lake Baikal
After breakfast we visit the Baikal Museum and the Cherskogo peak, from where we can admire Lake Baikal from an altitude of 728m. Before we go on a boat trip across the lake, we mingle with the people of the local market place.

Day 11: Listvyanka - Tulun, 450 km
On the way to Tulun we see many small villages and make a few stops. One of the most interesting places we meet on this route is Taishet Bike Guesthouse. We spend the night in a country hotel with Russian Banya on the bank of the river.

Day 12: Tulun - Krasnoyarsk, 650 km
Krasnoyarsk is located on the Yenisei River, one of the longest rivers in the world. We check into our hotel and explore the city center on foot. On the way we will have dinner in a local restaurant and go to bed early. Tomorrow we need to be good on foot.

Day 13: Krasnoyarsk
Our motorcycles will be serviced and we will take a trip to Krasnoyarsk National Park "Stolby". We spend at least half a day hiking and climbing in the hills and mountains and get a deep impression of the Russian taiga. Our dinner in the cozy restaurant with local cuisine will surely taste very special.

Day 14: Krasnoyarsk - Kemerovo, 540 km
We spend the night in Kemerovo, an industrial town, but clean and quiet. In the city center we will visit a beautiful dike on the Tom and numerous monuments

Day 15: Kemerovo - Novosibirsk, 300 km
A peaceful and beautiful road awaits us to Novosibirsk, the largest city on the Trans-Siberian route. Today Novosibirsk is the third largest city in Russia and the cultural and scientific capital of Siberia. In the evening we will collect some impressions of this city on foot.

Day 16: Novosibirsk - Omsk, 650 km
A quiet road to Omsk awaits us. On our way we will visit Ishim, a small town with preserved architecture from the 19th century. In Omsk we will take a walk through the city and visit the main sights.

Day 17: Omsk - Tyumen, 630 km
We ride to Tyumen, which we reach in the early evening. We will check in, park our motorcycles in the parking lot and explore Tyumen on foot. We will walk across the Tura River on the embankment and pedestrian bridge and visit the Znamenskiy Cathedral. We will also take a bath in the hot springs in the city center and then have dinner in a nearby restaurant.

Day 18: Tyumen - Yekaterinburg, 450 km
We continue our journey towards Yekaterinburg. Passing the town of Karabash with its Mars-like hills and moats and the town of Kysthym surrounded by mountains and blue lakes. In Yekaterinburg we will have lunch and a city walk.

Day 19: Yekaterinburg

We sleep in late and enjoy free time in the morning. In the afternoon we will take a walking tour of the city with a local guide.

Day 20: Yekaterinburg - Izhevsk, 710 km
Today will be a long day of riding with lots of scenic roads, oil production facilities and agricultural farming areas. In Izhevsk we stay in a "very local" hotel with interesting and delicious regional food.

Day 21: Izhevsk - Kazan, 350 km
Via well-maintained back roads and short sections of unpaved roads we ride to Kazan the Muslim capital and one of the most beautiful cities in the country. We will visit the Kremlin in Kazan, which is Russia's second largest Kremlin after Moscow and dates back to the 10th century.

Day 22: Kazan - Nizhny Novgorod, 460 km
One of the last days of riding lies ahead of us. On the way we stop in Kozmodemyansk to visit the ethnographic museum. In Nizhny Novgorod we will take a walk along the Volga embankment and visit the Kremlin.

Day 23: Nizhny Novgorod - Moscow, 550 km
Today we ride through Vladimir and Suzdal to Moscow. In Vladimir we will visit the Cathedral of the Assumption, an architectural wonder of the 12th century.

Day 24: Moscow
A sightseeing tour of Moscow: the Red Square, the Cathedral of Christ the Saviour, the Kremlin, the Moscow Underground (occasionally called "the underground museum"), Arbat Street (often called "Old Arbat") and many other attractions are on the programme.

Day 25: Journey home
After a very special trip, the time comes to say goodbye and all participants make their way home. We hope that you were so enthusiastic about Russia and the legend "Trans-Siberia" that one day you will come back for another tour and say to you:

"Do svidaniya" - Goodbye - in Russia.
