# The great South Africa Motorcycle Tour starts in Johannesburg, the financial capital of South Africa and ends two weeks later in Cape Town.

Tour Description:

Day 1: Arrival in Johannesburg - Pretoria. Arrival in Johannesburg, transfer to hotel in Pretoria, free time for city tour in Red Bus, meeting with tour guide.

Day 2: Pretoria - Sabie, 350 km From Pretoria over the northernmost foothills of the Drakensberg Mountains, over the Long Tom Pass into Mpumalanga Province to Sabie.

Day 3: Sabie - Malelane, 350 km From Sabie the Panorama Route is the theme today with breathtaking views at the Blyde River Canyon, God's Window, Wonder View and Bourke's Luck before we spend 2 nights at the Crocodile River in Malelane.

Day 4: Malelane - Malelane, 0 km Full day safari in Kruger National Park with open safari vehicle.

Day 5: Malelane - Swaziland, 200 km Malelane - Swaziland or E'Swatini as it is now called, capital Mbabane, Matsamo Cultural Village.

Day 6: Swaziland - St. Lucia, 360 km Mbabane, through the towns of Hluhluwe, Mtubatuba and finally St. Lucia. The Greater St. Lucia Wetland Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, surrounds the town of St. Lucia.

Day 7: St. Lucia - Underberg, 460 km After Mbabane along the KwaZulu-Natal coast south towards Durban to the Drakensberg Mountains, to Underberg. Day 8: Underberg - Underberg, 0 km Today at leisure or optional guided tour up Sani Pass.

Day 9: Underberg - Cintsa, 500 km From Underberg we ride along the southern Drakensberg Mountains through the Transkei, the heartland of the Xhosa people, which they call Mandela Land after their great statesman. Today's destination is Chintsa on the Wild Coast.

Day 10: Cintsa - Port Elizabeth, 380km
From Chintsa via the coastal route to Colchester near Port
Elizabeth, at the southern entrance to Addo Elephant
National Park, with the option of an afternoon safari.

Day 11: Port Elizabeth - Knysna, 300km Via the Garden Route we reach the Tsitsikamma Coastal Park and the Bloukrans Brigde, from where one of the deepest bungee jumps is possible. In the further course we come to Plettenberg-Bay and Knysna.

Day 12: Knysna - Oudtshoorn, 200 km After the Knysna-Head viewpoint and Wilderness, we reach George with postcard views of the Southern Cape coast before passing through the Outeniqua Mountains to the ostrich capital of Oudtshorn in the Klein Karoo region.

Day 13: Oudtshoorn - Cape Town, 480 km On our way to today's destination, Cape Town, we pass Barrydale, Montagu, Ashton, Robertson and cross the Franschhoek Pass into Cape Wineland.

Day 14: Cape Town - Cape Wineland, 170 km On our last day of touring we pull out all the stops again, on the program are Table Mountain National Park, Cape of Good Hope, Cape Point, and Chapman`Peak Drive.

like in the Kruger National Park - the safari icon of South Africa, in the Addo Elephant National Park, during encounters with the gray giants or in the iSimangaliso Wetland Park, with its crocodiles, hippos and rhinos.

#### Breathtaking landscapes,

From Table Mountain to God's Window, the legendary sky window at the Blyde River Canyon and the Drakensberg Mountains - the impressive landscape of South Africa captivates travelers.

# Blyde River Canyon

The view from above is a dream - on clear days you can see as far as the border of Mozambique. Where the rivers Joy (Blyde) and Grief (Treur) meet, a gorge up to 800 meters deep has been created, the third largest canyon in the world and certainly the greenest of its kind. The impressive landscape is located on the Panorama Route in Mpumalanga Province and stretches for 26 kilometers not far from the Kruger National Park. It is one of the great natural wonders of Africa. Its enormous round rocks, the rondavels, are reminiscent in their shape of traditional African round huts. Numerous vantage points offer fantastic views over the lush landscape.

Enchanting waterfalls adorn the landscape. Thousands of years the water has washed cylinder-like sculptures out of the red-yellow sandstone, which today are surrounded by small rock pools. The most famous among them are Bourke's Luck Potholes. In the 19th century, gold prospector Tom Bourke made a fortune here.

#### Kruger National Park

The flagship of South African national parks and the largest game reserve in South Africa should not be missed on the Great South Africa Motorcycle Tour. It is home to the Big Five - lion, elephant, rhino, buffalo and leopard. Worldwide, it is considered the region with the greatest biodiversity. And there are many more national parks.

Kruger National Park is home to thousands of animals - from giraffes foraging for acacia leaves and herds of

buffalo crossing the road right in front of you, to big cats of prey taking a nap in the shade and sea eagles letting out their distinctive cries. Here, African wildlife is at your feet.

You will hardly believe your eyes when you see huge herds of antelopes jumping around or crocodiles sunbathing, while hippos prefer the cool water under the water. The sounds of the wilderness won't let you go - hyenas giggling the night away while lions underline their supremacy with a loud roar, and with a bit of luck you'll even hear the almost silent footsteps of wild dogs on the prowl across the savannah.

#### iSimangaliso Wetland Park

In the iSimangaliso Wetland Park in KwaZulu-Natal, a true natural wonder awaits you, which has even been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Formerly known as St Lucia Wetland Park, this region is a natural paradise par excellence with gorgeous landscapes and a variety of wildlife (including the famous hawksbill and leatherback sea turtles).

In his speech on the historic reintroduction of elephants to the east coast of KwaZulu-Natal in 2002, Nelson Mandela said, "these wetlands are probably the only place in the world where the world's oldest land mammal (the rhino) and the world's largest land mammal (the elephant) share an ecosystem with the world's oldest fish (the coelacanth) as well as the world's largest marine mammal (the whale)."

Lake St Lucia is Africa's largest estuary and is home to 800 hippos and 1,200 crocodiles. Flocks of pelicans and flamingos populate the large lake, making it a birdwatcher's paradise.

Culturally, iSimangaliso also has a lot to offer: it is home to important historical sites with a long history dating back to the Stone Age. On the coast you can admire the 700 year old fishing traps of Kosi Bay. Five African peoples feel at home here and give you a smile: Zulu, Swazi, Shangaan, Tonga and Gonda.

#### **Drakensberg Mountains**

The largest mountain range in South Africa is a truly magical place. uKhahlamba ("barrier of spears" in Zulu) in KwaZulu-Natal province is a wonderland of river valleys, craggy cliffs and stunning natural scenery. The Drakensberg Mountains are South Africa's mightiest elevation, rising up to 3,000 meters. Their natural beauty, plant diversity, and the greatest density of rock paintings have made the region a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

In fact, there are more than 600 archaeological sites in the area with over 35,000 rock paintings depicting San people, animals and spiritual life over a 4,000-year time frame. Later drawings from the 19th and 20th centuries date back to the Bantu people.

Giant's Castle Game Reserve is part of uKhahlamba-Drakensberg Park, known for its 5,000 San cave drawings. Scenic highlights here include Cathedral Peak, the Amphitheatre, Mont-aux-Sources and the Tugela waterfalls. In the southern Drakensberg Mountains, Sani Pass leads up into the mountain kingdom of Lesotho. The ride over the narrow pass is an adventure in itself. Arriving at an altitude of almost 3,000 meters, a visit to the highest pub in Africa

is worthwhile, as well as an encounter with the equestrian people of the Basotho.

#### Addo Elephant National Park

The Eastern Cape is the province of the Big Seven: In the Addo Elephant National Park near Port Elizabeth you can observe not only the Big Five (lion, leopard, rhinoceros, elephant and buffalo) but also two other fascinating creatures, namely whales and white sharks. The richness of species on land and water promises safari experiences in unimagined dimensions.

About 2,500 southern right and humpback whales migrate off the coast between July and November and join the resident Bryde's whales. Sharks are at home here all year round. With the extension of Addo Elephant National Park to the coast, you can also see thousands of African penguins, dolphins and Cape gannets on offshore islands like St. Croix - all in one place!

#### The Garden Route

The Great South Africa Motorcycle Tour also takes you along the famous Garden Route, through a unique nature reserve that is unsurpassed in its diversity of lagoons, coastal forests and fine sandy beaches. The journey of discovery along the south coast of the Western Cape starts in Port Elizabeth and leads along the N2 to Cape Town.

The Garden Route National Park, which connects the primeval forests of Tsitsikamma and the coast with the Wilderness National Park through a chain of lakes and fynbos sanctuaries, fascinates with a diverse mix of different ecosystems.

Situated between lakes, coastal forests and the sea, Wilderness enchants with its natural beauty. You can enjoy the picturesque bay and its seemingly endless beaches from Dolphin View Point, a vantage point located at the western end of town on the N2 coastal road. Knysna, situated on a beautiful lagoon, invites you to enjoy local oysters.

Plettenberg Bay is known as the "Jewel of the Garden Route". Off the coast in the season from July to November Southern Right whales and humpback whales, bottlenose dolphins and other species of dolphins and even killer whales cavort

#### Cape Town with Table Mountain

The whole world is raving about this view. Table Mountain, which towers majestically above the Mother City on the Cape, the oldest and most beautiful city in South Africa, is rightly counted among the seven natural wonders of the earth. Those who whiz up the 1,000 meters on the panoramic cable car can expect unique views over the entire Cape Peninsula and the sea, all the way to the world heritage site Robben Island.

The Great South Africa Motorcycle Tour is only complete with a visit to the sea-surrounded wild Cape of Good Hope and a ride along Chapman's Peak Drive.
