On your desired date, on your own, or with a group of friends. With the North/South Crossing of Australia you are guaranteed to experience a unique "Once in a lifetime" motorcycle trip - what are you waiting for?

Experience the turquoise sea and beautiful beaches around Darwin, in the UNESCO World Heritage Site Kakadu National Park a boat tour through the tropical rainforests, is worthwhile, before you ride deeper and deeper into the unique Outback. Amazing rock formations like the Devil's Marbles, the Olgas, the Kings Canyon, and of course the world-famous Uluru/Ayers Rock await you. Here in the Red Heart of Australia, the impressive culture of the Aborigines is just as fascinating as the special character of all the people who make their home here. Before the motorcycle tour ends in the vibrant metropolis of Melbourne, nature comes up trumps with one of the world's best wine regions, the Barossa Valley, the mighty mountains of the Grampians National Park, and one of the world's best motorcycle roads, the Great Ocean Road. Whether it lives up to its reputation, you judge for yourself - after you have ridden spectacular routes like the Oodnadatta Track, the Stuart Highway, and numerous kilometers through the outback and various national parks!

The following itinerary is only a suggestion! The exact route for your trip will be tailor-made and created according to your ideas!

Possible itinerary (changes possible):

Day 1: Arrival in Darwin

Arrival, transfer to the hotel

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Day 2: Darwin - Kakadu NP, 80 km

Pick up the motorcycle, and ride to the fascinating Kakadu National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It impresses with a unique variety of flora and fauna.

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Day 3: Free day in Kakadu NP

Today you will explore the Kakadu National Park. You can join a boat trip, with good chances to see crocodiles and numerous other species.

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Day 4: Kakadu NP - Katherine, 275 km

Visit the 20 million years old Nitmiluk National Park, a boat trip through Katherine Gorge.

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Day 5: Katherine - Daly Waters, 360 km

Continue towards the red center of the continent along the Gorrie/Dry River Hwy or the direct way via SH1 to Daly Waters. Here a true one-of-a-kind, typical Australian roadhouse awaits you: the Daly Waters Pub.

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Day 6: Daly Waters - Devil Marbels, 500 km

Continue south along the Stuart Highway, stopping in Newcastle Waters at the famous windmills and visiting the Gallery of Aboriginal Art in Tennant Creek. The famous rock formation Devil Marbles can marvel at in the evening or tomorrow morning.

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Day 7: Devils Marbles - Alice Springs, 410 km

Via the Stuart Highway, you reach the heart of Australia, Alice Springs in the Outback! The town is also the starting point of Uluru (Ayers Rock).

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Day 8: Free day in Alice Springs

Today you can explore Alice Springs, visit art galleries or just enjoy the specialness of the region. Or take a tour to Owen Springs Reserve or MacDonnell National Park.

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Day 21: Departure from Melbourne

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Day 9: Alice Springs - Kings Canyon, 470 km
Kings Canyon is a very spectacular destination, here you can take a walk through the canyon at sunset.

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Day 10: Kings Canyon - Uluru, 306 km
Today's ride takes about half a day to one of the most impressive natural phenomena in the world: Uluru (formerly Ayers Rock).

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Day 11: Free day in Uluru
Today's free day includes a ride to the famous Olgas, a hike through the Valley of the Wind, a helicopter tour, a camel ride, and much more!

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Day 12: Uluru - Marla, 500 km
From the center of the country, you continue southward, and the typical outback scenery remains unchanged. At Marla, the opal fields begin, and you will see the first cave dwellings.

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Day 13: Marla - Coober Pedy, 250 km
Today the stronghold of the opal seekers awaits you with Coober Pedy. After arrival, it is worthwhile to inform yourself about the fascination with opals, admire jewels in the galleries, etc.

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Day 14: Coober Pedy - William Creek, 500 km
Today starts with a visit to an opal mine (Old Timers Mine and Museum), at noon you will ride the famous Oodnadatta Track and of course stop at the famous Pink Roadhouse.

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Day 15: William Creek - Wilpena, 480 km
You leave William Creek (Australia's smallest town!) again and continue following the Oodnadatta Track. Take a dip in the warm waters of Coward Springs before passing through Mutonia Sculpture Park in Alberrie Creek.

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Day 16: Wilpena - Barossa Valley, 400 km
The contrasts could hardly be greater today. You start in the dry, beige Flinders Ranges and arrive in the world-famous, deep green, fertile wine region Barossa Valley - possibly even with a detour to the deep blue sea.

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Day 17: Barossa - Robe, 360 km
Another motorcycle highlight awaits you with the Adelaide Hills. After the mighty Murray River, crystal blue lagoons, dunes, and lakes welcome you to the Coorong N.P.

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Day 18: Robe - Halls Gap, 320 km
The over 400 million years old Grampians N.P. impresses with deep fern forests, lakes, rivers, and swamps - and wonderful motorcycle tracks.

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Day 19: Halls Gap - Port Campbell, 210 km
After some impressive viewpoints in the Grampians N.P. you ride southwards with destination Great Ocean Road - surely one of the most impressive motorcycle routes in the world!

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Day 20: Port Campbell - Melbourne, 290 km
The 12 Apostles, Loch Ard Gorge, the Bridge of London, and much more will inspire you along the Great Ocean Road! A detour to Cape Otway is also worthwhile before the trip ends in Melbourne.
